I. COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This class is an overview of the discipline of Sociology, or the study of human relations. This semester, we will examine some different perspectives on human interactions, as well as many controversial issues such as race, culture, religion, and sex.

The primary text for this course is Sociology; 10th edition by Schaefer (McGraw Hill, 2007). Additional materials will be made available by the instructor.

II. COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

A. ATTENDANCE AND CLASS PARTICIPATION: It is extremely important that all students arrive to each class session with all necessary materials on time and prepared for the lesson. Because so much information will be covered this semester, poor attendance will affect your ability to perform well in this class and will negatively affect your grade. Participation in class discussions and group activities is mandatory. You are responsible for getting notes you miss due to absences.

B. HOMEWORK AND EXAMS: Homework will consist mainly of reading assignments. Each unit will conclude with an exam. If you miss an exam, you have until the next exam to make it up or receive a zero. Exams are to be made up during support or by arrangement with the instructor. Students may use notes on all exams except make-ups, the culture exam, and the final. Due dates are the responsibility of the student; no late work will be accepted.

C. PROJECTS: There may be various projects assigned throughout the semester.

D. COMMUNITY SERVICE: There is a community service requirement for this class, which will count for approximately 10% of your final grade. The requirement is 40 hours. More on this project will be covered in class.

E. FINAL EXAM: There will be a final exam on the material covered in the course. It is very important that you keep good notes and get notes you miss due to an absence.

V. CLASSROOM RULES:

In addition to the rules and regulations of AHS and LVUSD,

There will be a zero tolerance policy for cheating; those who are caught cheating or plagiarizing the work of others will not receive credit for the assignment or exam, and a call home will be made. The policies of Agoura High School will be strictly enforced. If you keep up with the reading assignments, participate in class discussions, and complete the assigned work honestly, there will not be any need to cheat. Cheating includes, but is not limited to, cheating on tests, copying homework, plagiarizing research papers, etc.
